## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

### Applicant Profile

Dental practitioners who fulfil the following criteria will be eligible for acceptance onto the programme;

- evidence of full GDC registration
- evidence of full indemnity insurance
- evidence of a relevant dental degree

Medical practitioners who fulfil the following criteria will be eligible for acceptance onto the programme;

- evidence of full GMC registration
- evidence of full indemnity insurance
- evidence of a relevant medical degree

Nurse practitioners who fulfil the following criteria will be eligible for acceptance onto the programme;

- evidence of full NMC registration
- evidence of full indemnity insurance
- evidence of a relevant nursing degree

### English language requirements

Students whose first language is not English must possess a current qualification deemed acceptable by the University as evidence of proficiency in the English Language. This qualification must equate to a minimum average score of 6.5 or above (no element below 5.5) from the Cambridge/British Council English Language Testing Service (IELTS) or alternative examinations as recognised by the University.

### Alternative Entry requirements

Accreditation of Prior Learning (APL)
